PR-03	Remove spilled oil by collecting it in a sorbent material	600 ft sorbent boom 600 ft sorbent pom-poms 17 anchor stakes  N/A  Testing Date	2 shore responders  Tested	Place and stake snare or sorbent boom in areas that are likely to pool and collect oil and across the mouths of the streams and intertidal areas. Use snare boom for persistent oils and sorbent boom for non-persistent oils. Approach the streams and intertidal areas on rising tide. Replace as necessary to maximize oil recovery.		
SR-04	Remove spilled oil that has been diverted to a designated recovery site accessible from shore	2 skimming system 2 storage tank or bladder 2 hoses, pumps, fittings  N/A  Testing Date	2 shore responders  Tested	Set up shoreside recovery tactic at general location depicted on map. Some access points located at private residences. Access may be difficult.
